

The President's Remarks

Spring (hopefully) greetings everyone. I'm pleased to report that CSSE/SCIS' recognition of the Centenary of Canada's Submarine Service concluded with two recent events. At the invitation of RAdm Bill Truelove, a delegation of Vancouver Island members, including Ken Putt, Robin Black, Gerry Buydens, UVIC Dean of Engineering Tom Tiedje, VAdm (Ret'd) Nigel Brodeur and RAdm (Ret'd) Richard Greenwood, accompanied myself and UVIC AVP External Relations Tom Zsolnay, to a Commander, MARPAC Honours and Awards Ceremony at which Seaspan/Victoria Shipyards VP and General Manager Malcolm Barker was cited for his unstinting corporate and personal assistance to CFB Esquimalt. We were privileged with the opportunity to also express CSSE/

Some significant community building resulted from these CSSE/ SCIS facilitated recognitions. Locally, the bonds between the RCN and UVIC were strengthened; already DND and its associated industry partners are UVIC's largest source of engineering co-op placements; opportunities for enhancement and expansion of

teaching and research cooperation will be explored through further engagement at both the university's administration and faculty levels. Nationally, the connections made with the RCN in Ottawa and Halifax offer additional opportunities to build beneficial partnerships.

As our CSSE year moves inexorably towards to its culmination at our May AGM in Winnipeg, I'm pleased to report that the work of several of our Committees is progressing apace. Our Constitution and Bylaws Committee, chaired by Pieter Van Vliet, has been actively working on an updated version of the Bylaws to meet the requirements for registration with Industry Canada (including our new CSSE/SCIS Logo). With input from various members, its work is based on the directions of previously approved Board decisions and takes into account the work of our Secretary to remove the many administrative details from the Bylaws and compile them into the Standard Operating Procedures. Both documents are a work in progress. Unless major structural changes are required, this will obviate the need for changing the Bylaws each year to accommodate administrative changes.
