



With the festive season rapidly approaching, December is a busy month for CSSE Members both personally and within our profession. December 6th marked one of the saddest days in our profession's calendar, the anniversary of the tragic slaying of female students at École Polytechnique. On a happier note, CSSE congratulates the several engineers who were named as one of Canada's 100 Most Powerful Women. If you're headed to Brazil soon, note that it celebrates Engineering Day on December 11th (see a full listing of international celebrations at **Engineer's Day**).

As noted throughout this newsletter, our Society is active on many fronts. Several charitable awards have been recently presented to organizations who encourage youth to take up

careers in science and engineering. Branch meetings are occurring across the country. CSSE's Advocacy Working Group is progressing synopses on six topics and Guy Van Uytven is developing a paper on the need and benefits of a national energy grid jointly with Clem Bowman (on behalf of the Canadian Academy of Engineering). Our Honours and Awards Committee, Chaired by Jon Jennekens, OC is beginning its deliberations for the bestowal of Fellowships at our 2015 AGM. Several members are again contributing to the organization of EIC's 4th bi-annual Climate Change Technology Conference (CCTC 2015) to be held in Montreal May 25th-27th. The AGM Committee, lead by Ron Britton and Dave Ennis, are progressing an active Agenda for the meeting to be held in Winnipeg, Friday, May 29nd. Visitations to area sites of engineering and personal interest are being planned; IEEE has offered to partner in this event. Details will follow in our next newsletter but circle the last weekend of May on your calendars now.

Our focus on new membership development is bearing fruit. I encourage you to invite one or more colleagues to join CSSE/SCIS in 2015. New blood is essential for the continuity of our contribution to our profession, our society at large and to our youth whom we wish to attract to take our places.

A potential partnership opportunity with the international Pacific Northwest Economic Region (www.pnwer.org) has been identified. Andrew Pape-Salmon, PEng, of Victoria, has gained regional prominence for his work in highly energy efficient new building design and existing building retrofit - an essential element of compliance with energy conservation and reduced carbon emission standards. There is significant opportunity for CSSE members to contribute to the establishment of the 2030 "net zero" building emissions roadmap that PNWER is developing.

In closing, it is my great pleasure to thank all members who are contributing to the work of CSSE/SCIS - from those referenced above, to those too often unseen members who produce our ever expanding website, edit our publications and keep us administratively on track.
