

## 100th Anniversary of the Quebec Bridge

Construction was ultimately completed on September 20, 1917, at a total cost of \$25 million and 88 bridge workers' lives. On October 17, 1917, a locomotive used it to cross the St Lawrence River. On December 3, 1917, it was opened to normal railway traffic, after almost two decades of construction. Its center span of 549 meters (1800 ft.) remains the longest cantilevered bridge span in the world and is considered a major engineering feat.

#### CSSE Edmonton Branch Report, October 2017

The CSSE donations to the Discover E and the Alberta Science Network (ASN) were presented during the summer.

The Edmonton Branch program of monthly lunch and speaker meetings continues as in the past. Attendance at both events experienced a usual fall low attendance of less than 20 quests.

In September **John McDougall** spoke about Rethinking Canadian Infrastructure: A Strategic Northern Corridor. **John** served as President of the National Research Council from 2010 to 2016 and was President and CEO of the Alberta Research Council from 1997-2009.

His presentation was on an updated concept for a northern transportation corridor establishing a strategic 7,000 km right-of-way for transportation, power transmission and communications infrastructure based on local consultation and the negotiation of appropriate land usage rights. The right-of-way would connect three oceans and link to the existing (southern-focused) transportation network.

In October **Ibrahim Karidio**, PhD, PEng, MBA, Thermo Chemical Engineer, City of Edmonton, Edmonton, AB. "Waste Conversion Innovations at the Edmonton Waste Management Centre".

Edmonton has turned the landfill crisis of the 1980s into an opportunity; the opportunity to lead the world in sustainable waste management. Today, using a multi-faceted approach that integrates innovation, science, community engagement, social marketing and education, Edmonton is leading the way towards a 90% diversion of residential solid waste from landfill. Most of this innovation is taking place at the Edmonton Waste Management Centre (EWMC), which is North America's largest collection of modern, integrated and sustainable waste processing and research facilities.
