

As some of you may be aware, CSSE-SCIS Past-President, Colin Smith and I have been actively working with some US State Boards of Engineers and Land Surveyors on the mutual recognition of professional licenses through APEGS' and EGBC's involvement with PNWER (Pacific NorthWest Economic Region). Idaho is currently the only state within the PNWER region that will recognize a Canadian Professional Engineer and license them in a similar manner as the Canadian associations would license Canadian professionals through mobility. A few others, including Texas (under NAFTA), Nevada, Arizona and Utah also register P.Eng.'s as PE's under comity licensure provisions. We have been working with Oregon, Washington, Alaska and Montana and are in varying degrees of negotiations with each of these jurisdictions. However, even without these agreements in place, that should not limit our ability to respond on an emergency basis, if called upon.

Your CSSE Officers have been busy through the summer following up on action items that resulted from the May Board and Annual Meetings held in Regina. We are also closing in on a location and date for the 2018 Annual Meeting. We hope to be able to make an announcement with respect to that in the near future. I would like to personally thank Suzelle Barrington and Bill Altimas for their efforts in this area.

While fall leads us towards the end of the calendar year, it also is the start of the new academic year with many of our members getting involved in teaching or other outreach activities. I appreciate what all of you do to promote engineering and science as careers to our youth and would encourage you to share some of your experiences with all of the CSSE membership.
