Your suggestions and proposals as to potential topics of interest will be most welcome.

Please note that it is mentioned that your reactions are expected before December 15, 2013; this was based on an issue to you earlier than as per the present schedule and, of course, we want to proceed without much delay but we will surely accept all reactions made available before the end of year.

It is hoped that this Action Proposal will be met with enthusiasm.

On a totally different matter, on Friday December 6, a delegation from the CSSE went to the Canadian Space Agency in Longueuil, Quebec, to present to the Director of the Astronauts Dr Jean-Marc Comtois copies, that is a copy for each Astronaut, of the Citation presented by Colin Smith to the Acting Vice-president of the CSA Gilles Leclerc last May in Quebec City. The group then enjoyed a very interesting visit. A picture of this presentation is shown elsewhere in this edition.


