

Topic: Bonnybrook Wastewater Expansion

The Bonnybrook Wastewater Treatment Plant is the largest of Calgary's three wastewater treatment plants. Originally built in the 1930s, Bonnybrook has undergone significant modifications and upgrades over time to increase its treatment capacity to meet the needs of a growing city. Bonnybrook serves the city communities north of Glenmore Trail, as well as Cochrane, Airdrie and the Elbow Valley. The City of Calgary is investing over \$1 Billion in a program of extensive upgrades and expansions to the Bonnybrook Wastewater Treatment Plant. These investments are intended to protect the environment and accommodate our city's future growth. This expansion program will:

- Expand the capacity of the plant to treat wastewater;
- Accommodate population growth until the mid-2030s; and
- Increase energy efficiency and resiliency.

In June of this year, 4 Victoria CSSE Fellows (Black, Kjosness, Putt and Van Uytven) judged the UVic EE499 Capstone showcase for 4th year students from Biomedical Engineering (BME), Electrical and Computer Engineering (EE) and Software Engineering (SE) disciplines.

The winning Team for the CSSE VIB Vancouver Island Engineering Society (VIES) Award for Innovation, Engineering, and Commercialization potential contained team members from all three of these programs.

The VICTA (Vancouver Island Cosmic-ray

Time-coincidence Array) project provides cosmic ray detectors and electronics to high school partners on Vancouver Island for use in their educational programs. The equipment provided allows high school students to detect cosmic ray showers, measure the lifetime and speed of muons, to perform a test of special relativity, and in general to develop an understanding of a radiation detector and how subatomic particles are detected. CSSE provides an annual \$1,000 grant.

On August 29th, Victoria CSSE Fellows made a presentation of the \$1,000 CSSE/SCIS donation to VICTA the Vancouver Island Cosmic-ray Time-domain Array project, currently implemented in four regional high schools. The VICTA program stimulates and inspires youth by awakening their curiosity and interest in science and engineering.
